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# • Introduction

The Association of Waldorf Schools of North America (AWSNA) is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to strengthen and support Waldorf schools and teacher education institutes throughout North America. One aspect of this is providing financial assistance to people training to be Waldorf teachers to teach at schools in the United States, Canada, and Mexico. These programs are made possible by contributions to AWSNA from member and sponsored schools and institutes, and by grants from the Waldorf Education Foundation.

We are pleased to be able to offer two programs for this purpose: our Loanto-Grant program, wherein funds that are borrowed from AWSNA are transformed to grant status as graduates of training programs teach in AWSNA-affiliated Waldorf schools, and our Matching-Grant program for people already teaching in AWSNA-affiliated schools as they pursue their training, wherein AWSNA provides outright grants that are matched by the school at which the applicant is teaching.

# Joan-to-grant program

This program is designed for students completing their Waldorf teacher training programs, with the intention of becoming a full-time Waldorf teacher at an AWSNA-affiliated Waldorf school in North America.

- Each student may apply for up to 60% of the year's tuition fees to be covered by the loan-to-grant program. Foundation Year students are not eligible for these funds.
- Funds are distributed as a loan, repayable to AWSNA.
   Each year that the recipient works at least ¾ time at an AWSNA-affiliated Waldorf school (or WECAN-affiliated early childhood program) upon graduation, one-third of the original loan amount will be converted to grant status.
- Loans are interest-free during study and while
  working full-time as a Waldorf teacher. Failure to
  complete the training, or to teach full time at a school
  as described above upon graduation, will cause the
  loan to become due and payable, as per the terms of
  the Teacher Training Fund Loan contract.

# How to Apply

- Students apply for AWSNA teacher training loans directly through the training institution they are attending. Please contact the Registrar or Financial Officer for an application. Your application will be reviewed by the institute and submitted along with other applications for the funds allocated to that institution.
- Application deadlines are set by the institute, but are generally in late May for fall enrollment. Consult your institute for exact dates of application and award notification. Funds are distributed directly to the institute as a tuition payment.

# . Matching grant program

This program is designed for individuals currently working in AWSNA-affiliated Waldorf schools who have not yet completed the coursework for a Waldorf teaching diploma.

- Applicants may apply for grants from AWSNA for up to 50% of tuition fees. All grants are contingent on a matching grant from the school at which the grant recipient teaches.
- In cases where the combined total of AWSNA and school matching grants does not reach 100% of tuition, applicants may also apply for the loanto-grant program with the approval of the teacher-training institute.

# How to Apply

- Students apply for AWSNA matching grants
  directly through the training institution they are
  attending. Please contact the Registrar or Financial
  Officer for an application. Your application will be
  reviewed by the institute and submitted along with
  other applications for the funds allocated to that
  institution.
- The application must be accompanied by a letter from the school where the applicant teaches, specifying the amount of matching funds to which the school will commit.
- Application deadlines are set by the institute, but are generally set in late May for fall enrollment.
   Consult your institute for exact dates of application and award notification. Funds are distributed directly to the institute as a tuition payment.
